A Black History of Britain,

we would like to invite you to the unveiling of a BBC

History plaque at **St Bartholomew's Hospital** to

commemorate 18th century former slave **Jonathan Strong** and abolitionist **Granville Sharp**.

In 1765, enslaved teenager, Jonathan Strong, approached Granville Sharp (1735 - 1813) and his brother for help having been beaten to within an inch of his life by his owner. Strong was brought to St Bartholomew's Hospital where he was treated and recovered from his wounds. His ordeal inspired Sharp to campaign against slavery. We will remember both men with a brief reading and the unveiling of a commemorative plaque on:
